#### Lodge Road Footpath

For the last 15 years Summerleaze Ltd has operated a quarry and landfill at Whistley Court and Lea Farms adjacent to Lodge Road, Hurst. During this time, through the forum of a liaison group, Summerleaze has kept residents of the parish informed as to what activities and progress were being made on site. Summerleaze was keen to provide something for the Hurst residents, following the closure of the site, which would be appreciated and well used; hence the construction of a footpath on Summerleaze land set back from the busy Lodge Road.

To help in achieving this Summerleaze was able to gain funds from landfill tax credits through the Groundwork Trust, who designed and project managed the construction of the footpath.

The path is over 700m long and 2m wide. It is a permissive footpath across land owned by Summerleaze and provides a tranquil and safe alternative to walking on the grass verge of Lodge Road.

The path has been designed for use by pedestrians and cyclists, and is also wheelchair accessible. Unfortunately the path has not been designed to be a bridle path, and the surface can be easily damaged if used by horses.

Wildlife is abundant along the route - watch out for dragonflies and damselflies, and spot red kites and buzzards gliding over the nearby fields.

It is hoped that this new path will help to link up other public rights of way in the area, which will benefit all the inhabitants of Hurst and its surrounds.

#### **Exciting times at St Nicholas Pre-school**

St Nicholas Pre-school, now in its fourth decade and held daily in the Small Village Hall, is going from strength to strength. Many sessions are fully booked and the lunch club is thriving.

The grassed area near the Scout hut, has been fenced off to provide a large, secure outside play area for the children. The work was carried out free by **Bovis Lend Lease**, as part of their community support programme, and a huge thank you goes to them for their generosity.

#### Finding Hurst's oldest residents

It's strange to think that the oldest residents in the village are not people, but trees. Some of the largest trees in Hurst are hundreds of years old and date back to the time when the area was part of the forest of Windsor.

It is thought that the UK may have up to 80% of all ancient trees in Europe, but these are rapidly disappearing. They face threats such as careless developers, industry and road building schemes.

To help protect the oldest trees in the Wokingham Town area, the 'Veteran Tree Project' was initiated. Volunteers have so far located and mapped over 230 trees with a diameter of more than 1 metre. A database has been created which will enable these trees to be monitored and protected.

Following this initial success, the project has been rolled out to other parishes within the District. The **Parish Council and Hurst Village Society have jointly funded the project** in Hurst. The money covers promotion, training, compilation and presentation of the results. The actual surveying will need to be done by volunteers. Volunteers will be trained to measure the girth of trees, record the results and pinpoint the tree with a grid reference.

#### **Hurst War Memorial**

Local resident John Terry has been researching the lives of the men named on the Village War Memorial at St Nicholas Church. With the help of Duncan Kendall, this research is being published on a web site (www.warmemorial.org.uk) in memory of the soldiers from Hurst who gave their lives in the two World Wars.

This is work in progress but there are summary details for nearly all of the sixty six Hurst soldiers and biographies for around twenty of them. If you would like to know more about the sailor who trained on HMS Victory and fought at the Battle of Jutland, or the soldier who was in Queen Victoria's Household Cavalry and died in a First World War air raid, then these and other stories of heroism and sacrifice are now on the web.

Hurst soldiers gave their lives in the major campaigns of both wars and died in a dozen different countries across the globe. They were young men, predominantly volunteers in their twenties, who gave their lives gallantly for their country and remain deserving of our remembrance. #### **Townsend Pond**

#### Kitchen refurbishment

We have just completed a make-over of the kitchen in the Small Hall. New units, cupboards, tiling and flooring make the room easy to keep clean. Main beneficiaries are the Pre-school group who use the hall every weekday but the rooms are also often booked for weekend parties.

#### **Mobile furniture**

We would like to thank the persons who 'borrowed' six of our upholstered chairs from the Committee Room some three years ago for returning them unexpectedly. If they are the persons who 'borrowed' four of our tables recently would they please return these soon?

#### **Disposal of Spare plot**

The Trustees are hoping to submit a planning application to construct a pair of semis on our spare plot of land adjoining Orchard Road. If successful the sale of the plot will raise sufficient funds to secure the long-term future of our valuable community asset.

The income from a sale could enable us to pay off our debts, undertake expensive remedial work to the roof of the Small Hall and the Caretakers house and still leave a nice lump sum to provide investment income. As a result we will be able to sustain a high standard of maintenance whilst still offering very competitive hiring rates.
